Please note that length measurement will be effected based on the total developed length ("abgewickelte Länge") (as in the past) in accordance with ISO Norm including a measurement tolerance of +/- 1cm (new precision).

Please note the preparation tolerance for DH skis only. This tolerance shall not be used in the conception phase but is there to compensate possible evolution of the skis due to preparation over a period of time.

**Width rule: no tolerance: preparation must be taken into account**
